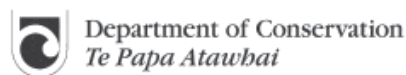

Ministry's mission and education outcomes

Our analysis of New Zealand's education system identifies those factors that will contribute most to the achievement of the government's education goals and to the Ministry's mission

RAISING ACHIEVEMENT AND REDUCING DISPARITY

The four major education sector outcomes we seek are:

- All New Zealanders with strong learning foundations
- High levels of achievement by all school leavers
- All New Zealanders engaged in learning throughout their lives and developing a highly skilled workforce

- Education making a strong contribution to our knowledge-base, especially in key areas of national development.

The Ministry's overall outcome focus and role

Our overall focus is on better learning for every New Zealander. Our work spans all stages of learning, from a child's initial learning to the adult becoming a lifelong learner.

Research identifies three critical areas of influence:

- Teachers and the effectiveness of their teaching
- Parents, families and their role in supporting learning
- Providers who not only focus on overall achievement but also on strengthening teacher effectiveness and parent and community support.

With these three areas in mind, the Ministry works with the sector to:

- Ensure there are high expectations of what all students can and should achieve
- Create a system-wide focus on raising achievement for all students
- Promote evidence-based decision-making
- Promote transparency and openness of information
- Support effective alignment and connection between family, home and cultural backgrounds and learning processes.

The Ministry will continue to move towards a greater role in building the knowledge-base and capability of the sector.

We identify examples and evidence of good practice and make expected standards of achievement and effective practice more transparent. The Ministry monitors system and provider performance and intervenes in situations where there is risk of under performance or failure and where assistance is required. How the Ministry decides to act, to influence or to intervene must be based on informed judgement and high quality decision-making.

From 1 October 2003, Early Childhood Development (ECD) integrated with the Ministry to promote and encourage the development and provision of quality, accessible and appropriate early childhood services.

Throughout New Zealand there are Pākehā, Māori and Pasifika staff available to provide the following programmes:

- Parent support programmes Awhina Matua and Increased Participation. These programmes mostly focus on Māori and Pasifika families whose children are not attending early childhood education, with a view to raising their awareness of the importance of early childhood education and linking the children into new or existing services.
- License Exempt Support for parents to operate community early childhood groups for their children. Services provided include funding operational grants, providing resources and workshops and advice from Ministry of Education coordinators. We support general playgroups, Pasifika early childhood groups and Ngā Puna Kohungahunga/ Māori playgroups.
- Licensing and Chartering Support for community groups who wish to set up as licensed and chartered early childhood centres under the Education (Early Childhood Centres) Regulations 1998. We support general licensed centres, Pasifika licensed centres and Māori immersion licensed centres.
- Professional Development Programmes provide professional support for staff and management in licensed and chartered early childhood centres. The Ministry of Education offers a variety of programmes including those that focus on Māori immersion centres, and Pasifika licensed centres.
- The Ministry is responsible for managing the contract that delivers all training to Family Start Whanau Workers and is also responsible for training Family Start Whanau Workers to deliver the Ahuru Mowai and Born To Learn Curriculum.

- Parents as First Teachers. Trained parent educators share information, practical ideas and guidance to parents of children aged 0-3 years through a programme of regular home visits, using the Ahuru Mowai and Born to Learn curriculum. The Ministry manages contracts with a variety of community organisations that provide this service. The Ministry also provides a service developed for Māori children who are referred from the court cases related to the Domestic Violence Act and provides training for iwi providers and organisations for their delivery of this same programme.

The Education Review Office (ERO) reports publicly on the quality of education in all New Zealand schools and early childhood education services, including private schools, kura kaupapa Māori (Māori language immersion schools) and kōhanga reo (Māori language early childhood groups).

This involves reviewing and evaluating all aspects of school and early childhood services including the quality of teaching, the quality of students' learning, and the role of management and elected school trustees. Excellence in education for New Zealand children is a high priority for the New Zealand Government. ERO's findings help boards of trustees and managers with policy development and decision making for their own schools and services, and contribute to high quality decisions for students' education by government policy makers.

ERO has approximately 170 review officers in its 10 offices nationwide. Te Uepū-ā-Motu, ERO's specialist Māori education unit, works from Corporate Office, as does the Homeschool Unit. The specialist Pacific Islands education unit, Moana Pasifika, is based in the Auckland office.
